The site of the Tocumwal WAAAF Creek Walk Outdoor Museum and Interpretation Trail, a celebration of the contribution of the WAAAF to Australian's WWII effort the creek is an anabranch of the Murray River with its water, flows joining the Tuppal Creek. There is significant indigenous tree canopy; however, the lower storey and riparian areas have low-quality vegetation. Many weed species have invaded the creek environment. These include Oxalis spp. Thistle spp.,Tree Lucerne, Ivy spp., Nettle spp., Morning Glory, Prickly Pear, Privit spp. and Bindi. This project will improve water flows through bank shaping and encourage further development of riverine micro-habitats and control weeds through staged revegetation of the site.



A regionally significant and fully accessible riverine environment in the township of Tocumwal staged revegetation and bank reshaping is needed to restore riverine habitats, address bank erosion issues and to manage weeds that continue to threaten the indigenous

Rationale for Investment

The Tocumwal Creek WAAAF Creek Walk and Interpretative Trail celebrates WAAAF History at the creek & Tocumwal. A creek side trail it linked during WWII the Tocumwal town centre with the largest airforce establishment in Australia. At its peak, 4,581 RAAF servicemen and 422 WAAAF servicewomen served on the base.

This project in addition to addressing the environmental values associated with restoration of the indigenous plants, and riverine micro-climates and the preservation of indigenous tree canopy will leverage the Council's and the community's investment in celebrating and recognizing the unique history and story of the WAAAF. The project will complete the implementation of the WAAAF Creek Walk Master Plan - a strategy developed by the Berrigan Shire Council in partnership with the Rotary Club of Tocumwal and the Tocumwal Farmers Market

CWA Playspace Upgrade


The CWA Playspace Upgrade Project will involve the removal of the existing combination unit and swings, with the existing rocker and shadesails to be retained. The new installations will consist of several static storybook themed items that encourage explorative and imaginative play. At the entrance to the playspace, two oversized toadstools will form an arch over an inground rock trail, and will act as the point at which users can look and anticipate what is beyond. Through the archway, further static items include a toadstool table and chairs, a hollow log tunnel, a gumleaf pod playhouse and a red-gum log stepper trail. The swing set will be replaced with a birds nest swing to allow for more inclusive use, and a free standing dragonfly slide and wheelchair accessible carousel will be installed.

PROJECT BRIEF

Pathways will be installed so access can be obtained from Deniliquin Street which is the main street, and from Morris Street which leads from the school and medical rooms. The pathways will also lead to the toilet amenities, which also provide disabled access. Rubber soft-fall leading to and surrounding play equipment will replace a significant amount of the existing soft-fall mulch to allow accessibility. All soft-fall areas will be bordered by concrete edges which are flush with adjacent surfaces. Existing gates that inhibit access will be removed to improve all ability access. This will not detract from the security of the site, as the entrances are situated a fair distance from the playspace, there are clear sight lines to the entrances from various points within the park, and the area is surrounded by fencing. Seating will be installed around the playground, as well as soft grassy mounds to allow for a more informal seating area. Picnic tables will be surrounded by granitic sand pavement to also allow for an east of access. The existing water fountain will be replaced with a DDA accessible water fountain.
