



PROJECT BRIEF

The Griffith Regional Sports Precinct - Westend Oval/Griffith Regional Aquatic Leisure Centre Development creates stateof-the -art sporting facilities across several high-profile sports, establishing a Regional Sports Hub at Westend Oval and enhances regionally significant sports facilities at the Griffith Regional Aquatic Leisure Centre (GRALC).

This project increases the number and type of regional sporting facilities, improves the standard of existing regional sporting facilities and increases participation and performance in the identified sports at all levels in the Western Riverina of regional NSW.

Activation for Westend Oval delivers new facilities for basketball, netball, hockey, badminton and athletics creating a regional sports hub incorporating several sites around the city to cater for regional and state level events and competitions.



To enable Stage 2 of the Griffith Regional Sports Precinct to be delivered, which involves providing additional built area in the foyer, additional change rooms, and function space.

Stage 2 also delivers storage requirements for sporting associations and completion of landscaping and fencing. Further development of Olympic Street Aquatic Facilities.

Rationale for Investment

The sporting infrastructure and the growth of the population of Griffith over the last 30 years are misaligned. The facilities capacity has not kept up with demand. This means we simply don't have enough sporting infrastructure to cater for our growing population. This infrastructure needs expansion to meet demand, to increase sports participation, and support performance growth.

Sporting organisations are an essential social fabric of our community and a way to help new residents make friends and engage with their community, resulting in them staying in Griffith for the long-term.

Throughout the consultation process, it was identified that council's sporting and community facilities cannot meet current, let alone future, demand across several sports including basketball, netball, hockey, swimming and athletics.

In all there are over 9,077 people from Griffith involved in the various sporting codes at Westend Oval and GRALC, this represents over 34% of the Griffith population engaging with our facilities on a regular basis.

This project will remove impediments to regional disadvantage through establishing a regional sports hub, and enhancing regionally significant sports facilities.

The project will also act to support regional growth outcomes by providing key sporting infrastructure that can assist potential residents in their decision making about potential relocation to regional centres such as Griffith and also to generate jobs through employment of more coaches, facility management and ground staff, event managers, accommodation businesses and hospitality businesses.

Council has an established mechanism through its relationship with Sports Marketing Australia to capitalise on more sports tourism as a result of having the higher quality facilities. This plays a key role in raising the profile of a destination, securing potential new residents and generating significant economic returns for both the local and State economies.





The project is designed to introduce long-term measures for the ongoing water quality of Lake Wyangan. This will involve the construction and operation of infrastructure which will aid the quality of inflow of water into the lake, the circulation of water within the lake, and the reduction of nutrients and salt from the lake.

Rationale for Investment

Lake Wyangan was built on gypsum mine in 1956, it is a closed system and does not have a natural water supply. Over the last 60 years there has been a build up of sediments, nutrients, and salt which need to be reduced for the long-term survival of the lake.

This project will improve the quality of a significant asset with great importance to the community. It will enhance recreation, tourism, and will increase the the potential provision of water for agricultural purposes.


Construction of Boorga Road and Dickie Rd. Enable efficient transport of primary produce.

PROJECT BRIEF

The project involves sealing Boorga Road and Dickie Road (approx. 10.1 kms). These roads are the key freight route for farming enterprises located in Nericon, on the northern boundary of the Griffith LGA. With over 55,000 truck and $vehicle\ movements\ per\ annum\ these\ roads\ are\ the\ only\ link\ from\ the\ farm\ gate\ to\ market\ in\ this\ area.\ Sealing\ these$ roads will remedy safety issues associated with the gravel road surface, sandy geological conditions and flat terrain. Currently the road has high volumes of dust in dry conditions, water over road during wet conditions, and a rough deteriorating surface when maintenance is not regularly carried out. The current road conditions contribute to loss of productivity, profit and safety concerns to businesses, and all of these constraints will be addressed by sealing both

OVERVIEW

CORRIDOR



The sealing of Boorga Road will provide the local community, farmgates, transport operators with a road that meets todays and the future needs of the region. The Boorga Road precinct punches above its weight in agricultural activities and provides produce that is transport across Australia and to export markets

Rationale for Investment

Boorga Road and Dickie Road are 10.5 km of unsealed roads servicing local farms, its employees, and residences. Up to 28,000 B-Double trucks use these roads annually carrying thousands of tonnes of produce. More than 250 workers rely on the road to travel to work at the farms in the area. Both roads are full of large rocks and pot holes. When it rains the road turns into a mud lake, becoming impassable for trucks to transport perishable produce. During 2016, these roads were inaccessible for 12 weeks due to heavy rain. During this time the farmers lost \$1.3 million revenue.

- Ongoing savings on operational and maintenance costs to council \$276,666
- Lower transportation costs and vehicle maintenance costs - transport operators more likely to continue to undertake work along route.
- Reduction in crash statistics, It is estimated that 80% of the current crashes are related to surface conditions associated with loose gravel and slippery when wet surfaces





Lake Wyangan - Recycle Water for Irrigation

PROJECT AT A GLANCE

Construction of an 8 km pipeline from Griffith Water Reclamation Plant to Lake Wyangan to sustainably use and manage water.

PROJECT BRIEF

This project will maximise the use of the high quality effluent from GWRP and also a saving of at least 1000 - 1500 ML water annually that can be used for another purpose. The project promotes the best water management strategy and provide environmental solution to the drought the State has to face from time to time in a sustainable manner.

Griffith City Council (GCC) employes the most advanced technology (Membrane Bio-reactor system) at Griffith Water Reclamation Plant (GWRP) that treats wastewater to significantly high quality. GCC currently holds a Section 60 approval for the reuse of the effluent from the plant at the Griffith Livestock Marketing Centre (GLMC). Currently only a fraction of the high quality effluent is recycled and GCC would like to extend the recycling of treated effluent.

The current use of the high quality effluent is (a) to top up the water level at old maturation ponds to maintain the environmental harmony e.g. flora and fauna, and bird population, and (b) used on site for washwater and site irrigation purpose. Most of the high quality effluent is being wasted into the drainage channel.

At the same time, Council has to use its high security water allocation (around 1500 ML annually) to top up Lake Wyangan water level to maintain the environmental of the lake and minimise blue green algae formation especially during summer when the evaporation rate is extremely high.

The Griffith Heavy Vehicle Strategy 2013 identified a southern corridor for heavy vehicle movement around the city of Griffith. The intersections at each end have been funded for upgrade in the past four years to install roundabouts to improve safety. This is the catalyst for the upgrade of Thorne Road.

Kurrajong Avenue between Oakes Road and Old Willbriggee Road requires an upgrade to accommodate both increased volumes and classes of vehicles as part of the GSIL. The upgrade will allow for b-doubles to HML and road trains to have authorised use. There are a number of utilities that will require relocation as part of this project.



The Griffith Heavy Vehicle Strategy 2013, has identified that upgrades to Thorne Rd and Kurrajong Avenue are required in order to accommodate increased volumes and higher classes of heavy vehicles as part of the GSIL.

Rationale for Investment

Griffith City Council has identified the proposed upgrade of Murrumbidgee Avenue and Thorne Road intersection as stage 4B in progressing with the GSIL. It is proposed that the intersection be designed to cater for higher mass and multicombination vehicles. Stage 4B of the GSIL will provide a direct link to key interregional and interstate freight networks as well as last mile connectivity to local commodity producers. Travel times, quality and safety for heavy vehicles will be improved significantly with the proposed upgrade of this intersection. It is also expected that there will be an improvement to the amenity and safety for pedestrians and passenger vehicles within Griffith as heavy vehicles utilise the GSIL rather than the current heavy vehicle route adjacent to City Park (Kookora Street) and Murrumbidgee High School (Griffith Campus) on Willandra Ave.
